Revenue Updates

- ➤ New growth estimate of \$400,000 has been lowered to \$300,000 loss of \$100,000 in revenue
 - Assessors can only capture new construction built through June 30, 2009 as new growth
 - ♦\$300,000 in new growth = \$300M in new construction

Revenue Updates

Enterprise Indirect Costs are estimated to decrease at least \$164,000 - potentially more

The Water, Sewer & Solid Waste funds reimburse the Town for indirect costs for their operation including insurance, employee benefits and use of staff and facilities

Expense Updates

- Budget reductions on the school side will result in layoffs
 - Individuals are entitled to collect unemployment and the Town's liability is payment for 26 weeks of benefits
 - Existing budget was \$100,000 for a year with no layoffs planned
 - Unemployment budget being increased by at least \$400,000

Plymouth County Health Group

➤ Every 1% less the premiums increase for FY 2009 – the savings equals approximately \$40,000

- Current increase estimated at 8% same as last year
