

## Marshfield Historical Commission Minutes

Meeting of February 1, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7PM in Hearing room 2 at the Town Hall. Attending were Cindy Castro, Barbara Carney, Carolyn Shanley, Kathy Sullivan, Michele Campion, Jack Arouca and Norma Haskins.

Demolition Application 1121 South River St- This house and barn to be partially demolished and replaced with a two family dwelling. The front of the building will remain. The builder supplied us with a copy of his plans. After review Cindy made a motion, seconded by Barbara that this building has no historical significance to the Town and we would have objection to the issuance of a demolition permit. It was voted and passed, unanimously.

Minutes from 1/4/22 meeting. After one amendment Cindy made a motion, seconded by Barbara to accept the minutes as amended. It was voted and passed, Michele abstaining as she was not there.

Treasurers report- Balance remains at \$3,221.08 and there are no outstanding bills.

Blacksmith shop- Cindy explained that we will need to designate the blacksmith shop as a historical structure. She has researched and found that this building was once a summer kitchen at a home on Old Colony Lane before it was moved to the Winslow house to become our Blacksmith shop. As soon as she can confirm her findings we will be voting to add it to our list. Rescheduled for our next meeting.

New Office space- Cindy reports most of the furniture has been moved into our new space. We are waiting for better weather to complete the moving of our file cabinets and collectibles to the new space. We should be able to hold our meeting there in the future.

Red Gold development- new barn- Building is meeting with Conservation Commission next. We are still waiting for a decision to be made on whether or not the Town will accept the barn for a historical display area.

The next meeting will be 3/1/22.
