



### Town of Marshfield Road Improvement Program Growth of Work (excludes State Roads)

	Length of Roads (Miles)	Catch Basins	Manholes	Drop Inlets
Before 1997	499,256 (94.6 Miles)	1,982	648	71
Added After 1997	220,189 (41.7 Miles)	981	549	39
Total	719,445 (136.3 Miles)	2,963	1,197	110
Change	44%	49%	85%	55%

Apparent expectation that the DPW staff can do over 40% more work with 25% less money and 50% less people!

#### Town of Marshfield Road Improvement Program

- Challenge:
  - More roads, catch basins, manholes and drop inlets;
  - Less funding and less people means less work that can be done.
- Requirements:
  - Increase FY-05 or equivalent Road Improvement Program Funding (Town and Chapter 90) to \$850,000 to take care of Public Roads accepted prior to 1997;
  - Increase FY-05 or equivalent Road Improvement Program Funding (Town and Chapter 90) by an additional \$350,000 to take care of Public Roads accepted after 1997;
  - Impose moratorium on acceptance of new roads unless funding is available to maintain and repair the roads;
  - Increase highway division staff by 8 people with additional equipment to repair and maintain road surfaces and drainage structures.

### Town of Marshfield Road Improvement Program

- Budget Impact:
  - \$500K Chapter 90 Funds
    - Include all accepted roads in MA Highway Database
  - \$700K Town Highway Funds (\$250K today)
  - \$265K for 8 new People (\$538K for 16 people today)
- Results:
  - Public roads will be properly maintained if the Road Improvement Program is funded to \$1,200,000 annually in CY 2004 dollars and Highway staff is increased by 8 people.
  - Net change is \$450K more for maintaining roads and \$265K more for 8 new people.
  - The current impact of the Town's Road Program (\$250K) and Highway Division staff (\$538K) on the average taxpayer is \$31.90 based on the FY-05 General Fund (GF) Budget of \$61,753,988. The impact of the change in the Town's Road Program (additional \$450K) and the Highway Division staff (additional \$265K) is \$28.95 for the average taxpayer based on the FY-05 General Fund Budget. Note: Average taxpayer pays about \$2,500 per year according to the Town Collector.

## Town of Marshfield Road Improvement Program

#### **Priority Roads Based on Usage and Public Facilities**

- Without adequate funding and staffing, the DPW will focus on maintaining higher priority roads and drainage structures only (54.825 Miles); remaining roads will only be maintained on emergency basis only, or as funding otherwise allows. The priority roads are:
  - Acorn Street / Beach Street / Canal Street / Canoe Tree Street
  - Careswell Street / Church Street / Clay Pit Road
  - Damon's Point Road / Dyke Road / Eames Way / Elm Street
  - Enterprise Drive / Ferry Street / Forest Street / Furnace Street
  - Grove Street / High Road / Highland Street / Oak Street
  - Ocean Street / Old Main Street / Old Main Street Extension
  - Old Ocean Street / Old Plain Street / Parsonage Street
  - Pine Street / Pleasant Street / Plymouth Avenue / Prospect Street
  - School Street / Sea Street / Snow Road / South River Street
  - Standish Street / Stratton Avenue / Summer Street
  - Town Pier Road / Union Street / Valley Path / Webster Street
  - Winslow Cemetery Road / Winslow Street

• Comparison of Double Stone Seal versus Paving for roads in 2004:

Length of Roads (Miles)	Square Yards	Stone Seal Cost	Overlay Cost	Milling Plus Overlay Cost
40,194 Feet (7.6125 Mi.)	82,593	\$234,140. \$5.83 per Foot	\$362,418.	\$860,255. \$21.40 per Foot

Note: We need to continue Double Stone Sealing to preserve Road Surfaces until such time as paving can be afforded. Marshfield has 4,270 drainage structures on Town maintained
