Board of Health Meeting opened at 6:00 pm

New Business – One 3 Nine Kitchen & Bar Health Code Permit Violation – On May 21, 2022, the food establishment One 3 Nine Kitchen & Bar violated town and state regulations because the establishment opened and operated without a food handler permit from the town of Marshfield. The Marshfield Police Department were called on the evening of May 21 and confirmed that One 3 Nine was open. On May 23, 2022, the Marshfield BOH conducted a food inspection and officially permitted the establishment. John Bruno, the owner of One 3 Nine Kitchen & Bar, attended the meeting to discuss the violations. He stated he forgot to submit the application and this issue wouldn't happen again. The Board stated this problem was unacceptable and Mr. Bruno had to get all his documentation in on time going forward. No fine was issued.

New Business – Beach Status Updates – The beach water quality testing program started on May 24, 2022. The marine water samples test for an indicator bacteria called Enterococci. Two weeks of sampling have been conducted and yielded all negative results. The first 4 weeks of testing are only completed at Rexhame and Green Harbor Beaches. The Department of Public Works has been contacted (Tom Reynolds) to find a suitable place to put a post at Blue Fish Cove Street. A post is needed in order to present beach closings to the community. Lastly, an email was sent by a Marshfield resident, Mike Fay, to the Board of Health requesting water bacteria testing be conducted at the Ocean Bluff Beach. The Board is currently exploring options for conducting water testing at that particular beach.

Mr. Armstrong made a motion to adjourn, all in agreement, the meeting was closed at 7:00 pm.
