The meeting convened at 7:20 p.m.

Robert Shaughnessy motioned to open the meeting and reviewed the evening's agenda which consisted of 5 action items. Seconded by John Cusick.

Action:

1. Approval Drain Layer License Renewals

2. Approval Septage Hauler Permit Renewals

3. Update on Capital Expenditures/Requests

Tom Reynolds indicated that he and Staff had met with the Advisory Board and Town Treasurer. We made our presentation but at this time we do not know what money will be available. Bob Shaughnessy indicated that we need to conduct a rate study; hire a consultant which we have done in the past. We need to look at the capital plan, five to ten years into the future; establish a time line.

4. Contract 2017-05/Change Order / Daniel Webster Law Office

Tom Reynolds explained the reason for the change order which is due to much wood rot in different areas of the office which needed to be replaced.

Bob Shaughnessy indicated that the DPW is doing the contract with CPA funds for the Daniel Webster Law Office. Tom stated that it has been difficult obtaining a contractor for the project and Rod Procaccino has worked very hard to accomplish this.

MOTION: Robert Shaughnessy motioned to approve the change order for Contract 2017-05 for the Daniel Webster Law Office, funded through the CPA funds not to exceed \$8,500.

Seconded: John Vallier All in favor.

5. <u>Discuss Special Town Meeting Articles</u>

Business Manager, Dan Bowen presented the articles for discussion. There are five for the warrant which as follows: 1A-Transfer from available funds \$60K for field maintenance on the 34 acres of new fields at the High School, Rockwood Road, Governor Winslow School and Coast Guard Hill: 3A-Vote to use retained earnings a sum of money from the Solid Waste Enterprise account to offset FY2017 Solid Waste expenses. 5A-Authorize the BPW to take permanent seawall easements previously authorized by Special Town Meeting of October 24, 2016, Article 7, for access for repairs and future maintenance. 2A-Authorize the BPW to take temporary and permanent easements for reconstruction of the Beach Street Bridge. 4A-Authorize the Town Finance Director-Treasurer/Collector transfer a sum of money from Water Enterprise Retained Earnings to replace the Spring Street Water Main.

John Cusick has issue with repaving the road curb to curb using Enterprise Funds. He would like to have Town Counsel review the legality of paving curb to curb using those funds. Tom Reynolds stated that he had discussed this question with John Cusick and explained that due to the many watermain breaks the road has been basically torn apart. The trenches have wiped out the road and personal properties where we have had to address. It should be repaired using the Enterprise Funds.

Tom will ask Town Counsel per Mr. Cusick's request.

Bob Shaughnessy and John Vallier are in agreement with the Superintendent that as a result of damages caused by the many watermain breaks paving curb to curb should be part of the project and ensure that it is legal. Tom will reach out to Town Counsel for an opinion.

MOTION: Robert Shaughnessy motioned to approve Article DPW 1-A, 3-A, 5-A, 2-A, and 4-A with the understanding that Town Counsel will provide a written opinion.
