Marshfield Historical Commission Minutes Meeting of April 5, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7PM in Hearing Room 2 at the Town Hall. Attending were Cindy Castro, Barbara Carney, Michele Campion, Kathy Sullivan, Carolyn Shanley and Norma Haskins.

Demolition application- 53 Concord St. A brief discussion followed regarding how we decide if a house is historically significant. After review Cindy made a motion, seconded by Michele, that this house at 53 Concord St has no historical significance to the Town and we would have no objection to the issuance of a demolition permit. It was voted and passed, with Carolyn being opposed.

Demolition application- 82 Wyoming St- Cindy reviewed. This cottage belongs to the Town and there are no plans to replace it. After review Cindy made a motion, seconded by Barbara that this house has no historical significance to the Town and we would have no objection to the issuance of a demolition permit. It was voted and passed, unanimously.

Secretary's Report- The minutes of our meeting of March 1st were reviewed. After review Cindy made a motion, seconded by Kathy to accept the minutes as prepared. It was voted and passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report- Michele reports there remains \$3,221. In our annual budget.

Training Green- Cindy reports there were two applications, one the Congregational Church for their annual church fair for July 2nd and the second from Seaside Gardeners for their annual plant sale on May 21st. She made a motion that we approve both of these applications, seconded by Michele. It was voted and passed, unanimously.

Town Meeting- Cindy reports Town Meeting articles coming up on April 25th include CPC funding articles for The Blacksmith Shop, Fire proof cabinets for the new office and Shipyard markers. Cindy has asked Jim Fitzgerald to speak in support of the Blacksmith Shop as we expect some opposition. CPC Committee has approved all these three applications.
