








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


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




How much has the Town spent on seawalls over the past 10 years?

In your neighborhood On your street or block On your property




WHY DOES THE AREA NEED A LONG-TERM COASTAL RESILIENCE PLAN?




Danger to residents and visitors



Danger to first responders




Costly for Town, State, and Federal government (really you, taxpayers)



Costly for homeowners, renters, businesses, and workers






Comm. of Massachusetts sea level rise projections


(Boston tide gauge)

Examples of flood risk reduction strategies

Purchase supplemental flood insurance

Wet floodproof basement/ground floor

Elevate your existing building or rebuild higher

Consolidate neighboring properties and raise grades

Vote at Town Meeting for investments in neighborhood flood protection

Increase onsite storage and drainage of wave overwash



Examples of policy incentives

Loans with no/low interest, long pay back periods, and/or hardship-based debt forgiveness

Information, administrative, or engineering support from Town staff

Increased taxes, assessments, or fees for higher public infrastructure/ program costs Property tax abatements for costs incurred

Regulations limiting or prohibiting building and/or rebuilding in high risk areas

Downgrading, disinvestment, or removal of public infrastructure and services


