Covid-19 Update

Supt. Granatino updated the Committee on the following:

- At MHS, currently 79.2% are vaccinated; 11-12 additional are needed to reach 80%
- The number of COVID cases continue to decrease
- Staff testing begins 2/2
- Approximately 1,300 students signed up for at home testing beginning 2/8
- Contact tracing along with Test & Stay will be discontinued 2/7

Mr. Greer asked if reporting a positive COVID test is mandatory. Supt. Granatino answered that it is requested that staff/students report a positive test result and quarantine for 5 days.

III. NEW BUSINESS

Calendar Update

Supt. Granatino presented the revised 2021-2022 calendar including 5 storm days indicating the current last day of school as 6/22. He also presented the revised 2022-2023 calendar revised to show 1/2 as the observance of New Year's Day.
