SPOTLIGHT ON EXCELLENCE: DWS Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Principal McNeil introduced the program, which is a school-wide design for behavioral interventions, and its 3 goals: Academic Achievement; SEL and Behavioral Health; along with Family and Community Engagement. DWS students are recognized daily for positive behavior and a "think sheet" is used to reflect on mistakes. At the recent pizza Outdoor Pizza Bingo Night, 8 EL families attended. The DWS motto for students and staff is Dedicated, Welcoming, Safe.

Mrs. Brait commented on Principal McNeil's ability to radiate positivity and passion at DWS.

II. OLD BUSINESS

MHS World Language Spanish South America Trip

Ms. Maura Bulman informed the SC that the students chose to visit Peru over Costa Rica for February vacation 2023.

III. NEW BUSINESS

Marshfield Education Foundation

Marie Kurmin and Susan Anderson, MEF Board Members, highlighted the MEF which was founded in 2010 to raise additional funding for innovative MPSD programs. The MEF board is comprised of 22 Marshfield residents who raise funds and award grants. The primary fundraising events include: Circus Smirkus, St. Patrick's Day 5K, and the Fall Giving Campaign. Grant applications are accepted from November through March. All grant applications are reviewed by MPSD administration to ensure they fit in the school frameworks. Grants are scored according to a rubric and those recommended for approval are presented to the MEF Board. In 2022, 9 grants were funded for \$80, 225. In 12 years, grants awarded total \$1,000,633.

MHS Science Costa Rica Trip

Ms. Laura Rose and Mr. Jim Merritt proposed an expedition in science to take classroom learning to Costa Rica. This would be their 4th time organizing this trip. Students collect school supplies and bring them to Costa Rica. The trip is open to up to 14 students enrolled in Environmental Science accompanied by 2 chaperones.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved to approve the MHS Science trip to Costa Rica. Mr. Costello second. VOTE: 5-0-0

Elementary Literacy

GWS teachers Ms. Janna Murphy and Ms. Pam Roberts presented on the Science of Reading movement which places a heavy focus on phonics and decodable text but does not support balanced literacy. The Science of Reading is a narrow view of a complex topic. MPSD uses many components of reading including: Heggerty; Foundations – Geodes; Geodes – Interactive Read Aloud; along with Journeys, Writing Units of Study, and Interactive Read Aloud. A universal dyslexia screener will be incorporated for grades K-1 in September, 2022.

Asst. Supt. Martin added that the best resources are used for each area of literacy.

MHS English Book Surplus

Asst. Supt. Martin reviewed the list of books considered surplus and added that some would be donated to Brockton High School.

MOTION: Mr. Costello moved to declare the books listed as surplus. Ms. Boyd second. VOTE: 5-0-0

Elementary and Middle School Math Program Adoptions

Asst. Supt. Martin announced that the Curriculum Council selected Bridges for K-5 mathematics and Illustrative Math for grades 6-8. The first year of Illustrative Math is grant funded and a grant application has been submitted for the Bridges program. Professional Development is included with both programs. Bridges also includes in intervention component.

Mr. Greer asked what was different about the new curriculum. Asst. Supt Martin answered that there is a better understanding of how students learn and the new math program takes that into account. Principal McNeil added that 100% of the Curriculum Council voted to adopt Bridges. Asst. Supt. Miller stated that the portion of the Bridges program that is not grant funded will be funded by ESSER funds. Mrs. Campbell asked how the different programs for elementary and middle school would integrate. Asst. Supt. Martin answered that vertical progression will be monitored.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved to approve the adoption of new elementary and middle school math programs. Mrs. Campbell second. VOTE: 5-0-0

Elementary Math Program Surplus

Asst. Supt. Martin proposed donating the K-5 Envision Math materials to More Than Words at the end of the school year. Ms. Boyd spoke in support of the More Than Words organization as it is a nonprofit social enterprise that empowers youth who are in the foster care system, court involved, homeless, or out of school to take charge of their lives by taking charge of a business.

MOTION: Mr. Costello moved to donate the K-5 Envision Math materials to More Than Words at the end of the 2021-2022 school year. Mr. Greer second. Vote 5-0-0

Elementary Reading Book Surplus

MOTION: Mr. Costello moved to declare consumable workbooks from our elementary reading program as surplus. Mr. Greer second. Vote 5-0-0
