SPOTLIGHT ON EXCELLENCE – Marshfield Education Foundation

Mr. John Giberti introduced himself as the new President of Marshfield Education Foundation and Ms. Elizabeth Burns and Mr. Gregory Reilly. The Marshfield Education Foundation supports creative and innovative ideas within Marshfield Public Schools. To date, over \$601,000 has been raised since 2011, funding a total of 128 grants. The Marshfield Education Foundation has four officers, two co-chairs, eight board members and two non-voting members. There are two main fund raisers during the year – St. Patrick's Day Run (this year on March 17, 2018) and Circus Smircus, including many sponsors (businesses and families) within the Town of Marshfield. Ms. Burns highlighted three grants recently funded. Mr. Reilly described the grant process. Grants will be turned in earlier this year, in February, rather than April. The core idea of the proposal must be creative educational initiatives. The Marshfield Education Foundation has been working as a partner with MPS for seven years; however, we have new teachers on board that need to know what MEF is about.

Supt. Granatino and Chair Costello thanked the Marshfield Education Foundation for all of the great work they have accomplished for Marshfield Public Schools.

MPSD 5-Year Capital Plan & FY'19 Capital Budget: Mr. Miller reviewed the 5-Year Capital Plan that had been discussed with the Capital Budget Subcommittee referencing security, safety and 21st

Century Technology. Both items are before the Committee for a first read. Mr. Miller highlighted the Capital Town Assessment Plan that includes facilities for all seven schools.

The 5-Year Plan is broken down by emergency, safety and high priority items. Mr. Miller has contacted the Marshfield Fire Department for their comments. Work has already begun on FBMS boilers and roof.

Granatino informed the Committee he had previously filled out a Disclosure of Appearance of Conflict of Interest due to the fact he has a relative who has worked at Marshfield Public Schools for the past ten years, prior to his being hired. It was recommended that in addition to filling out the Disclosure of Appearance of Conflict of Interest form, he make a public statement as he and the School Committee will begin negotiations in the upcoming months with the MEA. Granatino feels strongly he can complete his official duties objectively and fairly as he begins negotiation with the over 400 person bargaining association.
