<u>Marshfield High School AFS Exchange Trip:</u> Staff member, Patricia Salamone, and two MHS students Brooke Hart and Emma Murphy, explained the upcoming proposed AFS trip to Waterford, Wisconsin. Marshfield AFS families host students from Waterford, Wisconsin. Marshfield has a total of 10-15 students traveling with chaperones for this cultural experience.

<u>MCAS Update:</u> Ms. Laura Tilton, Director of District Data & Accountability, reviewed changes of the Next Generation MCAS as a baseline year. MCAS is one piece of data on our students to guide the district in supporting our students. Massachusetts has moved the bar and the test is more challenging.

<u>Elementary Enrichment Activity Fee:</u> Asst. Superintendent Dr. Ellen Martin reviewed the current tuition and explained the increase of \$10 for the six-week program to cover costs. Marshfield does not charge parents for supplies. The cost has not increased in eight years. Program is for Grades 3 through 5.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved to increase the Elementary After School Enrichment Program tuition from \$50 to \$60 per student. Mrs. Boyd second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

<u>Director of Special Education & Pupil Personnel:</u> Supt. Granatino noted the retirement of Asst. Superintendent Dr. Susan Dupuis in June, 2018. Supt. Granatino outlined the timeframe for posting the position, interviewing and hiring. The School Committee will meet the candidate on February 6, 2018.
