Marshfield High School Academic Standards: High School Principal, Mr. Robert Keuther, introduced members of the Academic Standards Committee; Kerry Doble, Parent; Robert Gallagher, MHS Staff member; Caralie Ford, MHS Director of Guidance. Committee began in the fall of 2017 Recommended changes will begin in 2023 (September's incoming freshmen) Mr. Keuther thanked the four MHS students sitting on the School Council: Catelyn Diramio, Thomas Joyce, Dana Kenneally and Jared Madeiros.

- School Committee approval

Areas Reviewed:

- Grading scale
- Graduation requirements
- GPA
- Weighted GPA scale
- Class rank elimination
- Final exam exemption

Final Recommendation:

- Increasing credits for graduation by 6
- No change in CORE credits
- Ensures comprehensive high school
- Technology standards are integrated into every classroom
- Opportunity for student choices
- Elimination of class rank this is not the information colleges and universities are looking for

MHS will work towards informing incoming freshmen students of these changes and they will be included in the 2019-2020 student handbook. The MHS Academic Standards will come back to the School Committee for a second read and vote on March 12.

<u>Early Childhood Tuition:</u> Supt. Granatino noted the increase per day from \$14,67 to \$16.07. Last increase was in 2011. This increase will allow new opportunities for our preschool students. Supt. Granatino thanked Director Donna Admirand for her hard work.
