IV. OLD BUSINESS

MHS Academic Standards: Presentation by Principal Keuther on February 26.

Curriculum Standards: Gives students the opportunity to dig a little deeper into their interests. We are adding additional credits so our students can have more choices. Our school district is committed to technology with exposure in all levels K-12. MHS students are prepared in the areas of computer science and technology.

Class Rank: This is a transition. Colleges are looking for the percentage of where our students falls in their class; top 10%, top 20%, etc. Percentages can be done at any number. We will continue to work with colleges on this. This is a change colleges are looking for. Class rank can be obtained at any time.

(Sean Costello could not be present tonight, but thanked MHS for their hard work on the Academic Standards.)

MOTION: Mrs. Church moved to approve new MHS graduation requirements in order for MHS students to receive a diploma earning 102 credits, as presented by the Academic Standards Committee, and passing the state required competency determination assessment through participation in MCAS testing. Mrs. Boyd second. VOTE: 4-0-0. (effective with the class of 2023)

MOTION: Mrs. Church moved to approve two-tiered MHS CORE GPA using five core content areas: English, Math Science, Social Studies and World Language, as presented by the Academic Standards Committee. Mrs. Boyd second. VOTE: 4-0-0. (effective with the class of 2023)

MOTION: Mrs. Campbell moved to approve the MHS WEIGHTED GPA that includes all core content areas along with all elective content areas as presented by the Academic Standards Committee. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 4-0-0 (effective with the class of 2023)

MOTION: Mrs. Campbell moved to approve the Class Rank Transition moving to a percentile rank using the MHS Core GPA. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 4-0-0. (effective with the class of 2021)

School Breakfast Program: Mr. Miller highlighted the newly mandated school breakfast program. Program is mandated for the Daniel Webster School but we are looking at all five elementary schools. Currently FBMS and MHS have breakfast programs. Program would be offered after the bus drops students off at school. We are talking with Principals, teachers, cafeteria staff, etc. We currently charge \$2 for a full breakfast (milk, juice, cereal or muffin) With this program we would receive reimbursement for all students. Final numbers will come back to the School Committee for a vote.

V. NEW BUSINESS

<u>District Policy:</u> District Nurse Leader, Jane Landry, explained the new Life Threatening Allergies Policy to Committee. Committee also received protocol & guidelines for internal administrative purposes.

Ms. Campbell asked several questions about nut free table and EpiPens. There is clear communication between the Principal, school nurse and teachers.

Ms. Church asked if allergy letter could go home to parents earlier in the school year.

Any comments on this new policy should be sent to Supt. Granatino. This policy will come back to the Committee for a second read and vote.

McKinney/Vento Homeless: Ms. Robynne Ryan-Lambert gave PowerPoint presentation. Marshfield has 70 to 80 students who fall under the homeless definition. Marshfield Public Schools tries to assist these students as much as possible. We provide educational stability,

tutors, work with Marshfield organizations to assist in after school programs, and we started a food and clothing bank at our middle and high school.

New program entitled 'Project Embrace' moving towards assisting our students.

Mrs. Boyd noted our schools play a large role in identify our homeless population. Families are not always aware of how to get help. Families can call '211' 24 hours a day to request assistance and access resources.
