V. OLD BUSINESS

<u>District-Wide Special Education Program Coordinator:</u> Ms. Scolaro highlighted key points from last Committee discussion relative to MPSD district programs, effective use of resources and best practice regarding specially designed instruction and inclusive education. This position will support our district programs. This position could become part of the educational budget in the future.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

<u>DECA Ultimate Power Trip, Washington, DC:</u> MHS students presented an overview of the DECA trip scheduled for November 15-17, missing one day of school. There will be two chaperones; Cost per student is approximately \$400.

Pilot Food & Snack Program: The District School Nurse, Jane Landry, presented the pilot program to the Committee. This pilot program is an outgrowth of the Homeless Council. Due to the overwhelming success of the program at the Extended School Year Program this past summer, the goal is to do a pilot program at the Governor Winslow School and Post Grad Program for the 2019-2020 school year. Mrs. Landry showed sample box to all present. If successful, the goal would be to expand the program to all schools. A snack pack consent form will go home to all Gov. Winslow and Post Grad families. The Marshfield Food Pantry is supplying everything for the snack boxes. Over the summer, Haymarket South supplied fresh fruit.

<u>FY'21 – FY'25 Capital Budget:</u> Mr. Miller reviewed the draft Capital Budget plan. Mr. Miller highlighted Technology Plan; vinyl composition tile at Daniel Webster School; heating control system at Martinson; 15 passenger multi-function activity school bus for the district; emergency life and safety issues; and paving and curbing at

individual elementary schools. This is a first read. The Capital Subcommittee will discuss and bring back recommendations to the full Committee.

<u>Clerical MOA:</u> Supt. Granatino noted the School Committee voted in Executive Session to ratify the three-year clerical agreement.
