

LONG-TERM COASTAL RESILIENCY PLAN PUBLIC WORKSHOP

The Town of Marshfield received a MVP Action Grant from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs to develop a Longterm Coastal Resiliency Plan.

The goal of this plan is to proactively address future coastal flooding and erosion risks under a changing climate. The plan will identify and prioritize the most at-risk sections of town and develop a set of guiding principles and recommended zoning policies that will allow the Town to proactively reduce vulnerabilities in these areas and, if necessary, rebuild in a more resilient way after a catastrophic event.

As a result of a previous public workshop, public survey, data collection, and costbenefit analysis, the Town has put together a draft Long-term Coastal Resiliency Plan.

Economic costs and benefits of different policy scenarios, including 'no action', were explored. The plan does NOT focus on engineering strategies like seawalls or beach nourishment.

This workshop will present the draft plan and solicit feedback from attendees. Please join us for an interactive workshop with Marshfield residents, Town staff, and elected officials.
